# This fall in Worship

I'm not sure any of us are completely virtuous, except for Jesus. But pondering the big virtues gives us important guides as we go through every stage of life. The "Big 7" are composed of two groups which have been named and taught by Christianity for over a thousand years. The first four are called the "Cardinal Virtues," because all other virtues in life are said to hinge upon these four: Prudence, Fortitude, Justice, and Temperance. These are very old-fashioned words, but their meaning is as current as that of today's news. Instead of "Cardinal Virtues," we could call them, "Hinge Virtues." More modern names for them might be Wisdom, Strength, Fairness, and Self-Control.

The final three virtues are called the "Theological Virtues" because they are uniquely directed toward our relationship with the living God: Faith, Hope, and Love.

God wants to grow each of these 7 Virtues in our hearts and lives. Which ones are strongest in you? Which ones do you most need right now? "The Big 7" series began on August 18, and concludes on September 15. If you miss any of the series, you can watch it online under the worship tab on our website at highlandlandumc.org.

On September 22, The Reverend Kevin Quick will be designing and leading the worship services to meet his ordination requirements for Deacon. That will be a great service!

On September 29, we will begin an uplifting 4-week series on Leadership taken from the book of Nehemiah. I've been thinking and praying about this since early June, and it seems the Lord's leading is to share it with you beginning the end of this month. I believe it will be inspiring and informative for all of us, because even though we may not realize it, all of us are leaders and influencers.




