



Dear Friends,

Have you done it yet? The Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) would like to hear how you think things are going at Highland. Your input matters. It can be a couple of sentences, or a couple of pages. But please send your

thoughts to Lee Smither at lee.smither@yahoo.com. Each year the Lead Pastor delivers to the Charge Conference a "State of the Church" summary, which includes an account of pastoral ministry. I wanted to share it with you. In a turbulent year which included an historic General Conference, this report covers attendance, giving, leadership, inclusion, pastoral care, staff leadership, and an invitation to voice your thoughts.

Attendance

Kevin Quick supplied the attendance data comparing in-person attendance from Jan- June in 2022, 23, and 24. I came to Highland in June 2022. Since the beginning of my tenure, total in-person worship has increased from 138-198, a 43% increase over a two-year period. We wait until the year's end for full-year comparisons. Attendance at the Connection has more than doubled in two years. The 11:00 service gained 19 in 2023 and lost 10 in 2024. Deaths and disabilities seem to take a heavier toll on the 11:00 service.

Giving

The financial information below compares General Fund pledges for those same three years, showing a 34% increase over the two-year period. This year we also ran an \$80,000 surplus through the summer, a first.

5-Year Plan and Leadership Development

I asked the Council to approve a "Joel Committee," which is a five-year planning team with multiple sub-groups for each ministry area. Meaningful, faithful, forward-looking plans are being generated primarily through a lay-led process.

Inclusion

As pastor of a Reconciling Ministries congregation, I asked the Council to include an LGBT+ subcommittee to create a 5-year plan for our ministry with LGBT+ people and their supporters, and to create an LGBT+ small group. This sub-committee did a great job. The original plan was more aggressive than some of our congregants were comfortable with, and I worked to help the two groups find common ground. Our Co-Lay Leader also wrote a letter of explanation to concerned parents.

Currently, we are forming a permanent LGBT+ ministry work area whose chair will have a seat on Church Council. I have also worked with this group to form a monthly LGBT+ fellowship group called Stonewall Fellowship.

We now have an excellent plan for increasing inclusion, which is sensitive to the desires of those who don't want to move too quickly. However, this process of compromise has angered some of our more progressive leaders. Please let SPRC know your thoughts, as requested by Chair, Lee Smither, in recent E-news announcements.

Pastoral Care, Outreach, Bible Study

Visiting the sick on weekdays as well as weekends, is one of the great joys of ministry for me, although the need always outstrips the time available. I give leadership to our church's Outreach including 120,000 postcards to our community, attempting to contact every first-time visitor, and keeping up with the progress of newcomers. I lead worship monthly at Springmoor Retirement Community. This Fall, I teach a weekly Bible study at Waltonwood on Mondays and at Church on Wednesday nights. I also work to help coordinate the ministries you read about below.

The Rev. Janet Baucom is a part time pastor with full-time impact. She leads multiple small groups and administers our lay-visitation ministry. She supports Sunday School, gives joyful leadership at both worship services, and is the pastor who meets with our Mission Team. Janet is also an integral part of our Reach Team. Perhaps most importantly, she co-led our Confirmation Class with Neil Smith and many wonderful Confirmation Mentors.

The Rev. Kevin Quick continues to expand our excellent music program as he leads the Connection Band, Handbells, Choir, Orchestra and other special music events. That is a lot of dedicated and talented volunteers, and he leads them well. One of the best things he and I have done together is to put together a plan for choral scholars, giving a stipend to student singers at our 11:00 services. As part of our pastoral staff, Kevin and Janet make hospital visits when I cannot.

Amy Takahashi, who directs our Children's Ministry, seems to outdo herself every year. For the past two years she has given leadership to our Wednesday evening meals, often preparing the meals herself with wonderful volunteer help. She has created multiple events for families with children including the Earth Day Festival, Fall Festival, VBS, Sleepout to End Homelessness, Movie Nights, Advent Workshops, and more. On a weekly basis, she provides a great Children's Sermon at both services, teaches Sunday School, and has Chapel Time for HCC children.

Neil Smith, our Youth Director, is appreciated by everyone. Youth, parents, and volunteers like him, admire him, and respect him. He has reinstated a Youth Bible Study on Wednesday nights which has been significant. He has given leadership to multiple mission and worship events including City Servants, and Highland Service Project. His Youth Program on Sunday evenings consistently draws 20-25 young people. As mentioned, he gave great leadership to our Confirmation Class this year.

Tom Lamb continues to make our facilities run smoothly. He is so good at this he makes it look easy. It isn't. We have two parsonages and a huge facility used by myriad groups every week. Major parts of our plant range in age from about 10 years to 70 years old. Tom is worth his weight in gold. Assisting him are our custodians Tung and Cing. This huge place is always clean and well-kept inside and out. These faithful Christians are the reason why.

Perhaps the most beautiful change to our facility this year has been the transformation of the Narthex. With cooperation from Tom and the Trustees, this lay-led group took it upon themselves to "do something" to make our Narthex more welcoming. They raised the money themselves, and they gave our congregation a beautiful gift!

Deanna Clack is our full-time business manager, administrating over two million dollars in revenue and expenses for our total operations annually. Always helpful, kind, and conscientious, our finances are managed with skill and probity.

Gretchen Shaffer is Director of our Highland Children's Center. HCC has the coveted 5-Star rating from the North Carolina Division of Child Development. Our HCC staff have worked together at Highland over 175 years combined. With a waiting list of over 350, this ministry led by Gretchen Shaffer and Judy Sprout is admired state-wide.

Stephenie Sanders is our three-quarter-time Director of Communications. If you have noticed how beautiful our Ridge Rider, website, E-News, postcards, and videos are, she is star of that show. This is an important part of our Reach to members, newcomers, and inquirers. Always fun to work with, her heart is in the ministry of this congregation.

Karen Winters is our part-time Administrative Assistant. Since coming aboard, she has worked with Janet Baucom to transition our database from ACS to Realm, which is a lot more complicated than anyone would expect. She has also navigated the preparations for Charge Conference and Consecration Sunday while keeping all the "regular" things flowing.

Our Missions Ministry continues to find and uplift some of the neediest people in our city and state. Our award-winning garden supplied over 1,700 pounds of food for local needy families. Using support dollars from you, Cullen Whitley led an intrepid group to the mountains a few weeks ago to aid hurricane victims. Flood Buckets have been prepared and taken to the Merci Center, and over 100 pounds of candy was delivered to Waynesville UMC from you, for their Trunk or Treat.

But the real star of all these ministries is YOU. Without your loving support, your faithful giving, and your enthusiastic work, none of this would be possible. Thank you for making Highland United Methodist Church a shining light on a hill through your commitment to LOVE, SERVE, and SHARE.

Highland United Methodist Church is set for another great year of ministry as 2025 dawns. But for a sound future, it is important to make sure everyone's voice is heard. 




Pancake Supper & Talent Show To Support Our Youth Mission Trip to Costa Rica




Pizza & Movie Night

We continue to operate with a significantly positive net income thanks to your continued support and dedication to Highland's ministries.


