



# From the Finance Office How to Maximize Your Stock Gifts

As we reflect on our blessings and the importance of giving, we want to remind you of some fantastic opportunities to contribute to our church in a way that can be beneficial for both you and our community.

Did you know that you can donate appreciated stock to the church? This method may be tax advantageous compared to selling the stock and donating the proceeds and could help you to avoid paying taxes on the appreciation of those assets. Instead of selling the stock, which could trigger capital gains tax, donating it directly lets you transfer the full value to the church, effectively maximizing your contribution. Additionally, if you are 70½ or older, you may also consider giving from your Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs). By donating your RMD directly to the church, you can avoid paying taxes on those amounts, making your giving even more impactful. These giving methods are a great way to support our church's mission while also making strategic financial decisions. ## A Thank You from our Disaster Response Team

To Our Dear Highland Family and Friends,

I would like to take this time to acknowledge the magnificent support that this church has bestowed upon our Disaster Response Team. In a lifetime of attending Highland, I have never witnessed such an immediate and passionate response to a disaster like the one this church has had to Hurricane Helene.

The NC Conference of the UMC calls us "The Hazard Tree Team." This is because we perform tree jobs that no other team in our Conference can safely handle. We were the first team called to respond to this disaster and have responded four times. Our base of operation has been Spruce Pine UMC. Our team has slept on cots in tents, in classrooms, the church bus floor, church pews, the sanctuary floor, and in trailers. We have had to carry everything that we could possibly use or need with us – there were no stores open to procure supplies. We are continuously procuring needed arboricultural equipment to respond to hazard tree situations.

If you were in worship during Advent, you saw several videos about our missions out West, and how they have turned out to be much, much more than hazard tree abatement. Our primary mission is to provide a loving and caring Christian presence wherever we go.

While doing disaster assessments, our team has come across situations that we could do nothing about; however, we saw individuals and families that lost everything, including loved ones. We were able to make small donations to some these people to help them solve some problems and just "get by."

True Saints make this possible by the private donations to me here at Highland. Thank you, my friends. Your donations make it possible for us to do the things that you heard about in the videos. Our team plans on returning as many times as it takes to assist with this disaster, but housing is still limited in the region. We are currently awaiting new deployment marching orders.

I do not possess the necessary vocabulary to adequately thank you all for your prayers, your presence, your gifts, and your service. May God bless you all as you have been, and will continue to be, a blessing to those that have been placed in harm's way.
