
We have come to the holy season of Lent. Lent can be a powerful time of spiritual renewal, or it can just be a few weeks when we wait for warmer weather. The difference will be determined by you. Spiritual renewal

obviously requires the work of the Holy Spirit, but the Holy Spirit is not the variable in this equation. The Holy Spirit always wants to bring us spiritual renewal. The variable is us.

There are a few themes of Lent which are hugely important to spiritual renewal. These themes deal with sin, guilt, atonement, faith, forgiveness and redemption. The world is certainly not interested in these topics, nor is the worldly Christian. The world believes there is no such thing as sin, but only "mistakes." The world believes a sense of guilt is an unhealthy social construct. The world believes there is no God who is heartbroken by our sin and offended by our rejection; therefore, there is no need for divine forgiveness. The world views the cross of Christ as a pitiful miscarriage of justice at best and as a primitive human sacrifice at worst. Rather than believing in a provident Heavenly Father, the world prefers to believe in "the Universe," a nameless, faceless, astral servant making no demands as it manifests positive energy and desired outcomes.

I invite you to make this a holy Lent, a transformational season, as we journey with Jesus to the Cross. In the next six weeks, we will ponder together the holy mysteries of sin, guilt, atonement, salvation, faith, and eternal life. I hope you will be with us.






