
Messy Church

Creation Celebration


Sunday, April 27, 4-6 PM




YOUTH NEWS

From Our Minister of Music



Hi Highland family!

I wanted to take a moment and give thanks for all the ways that you support our music ministry. As a church, we budget a certain amount for music ministry every

year, but this money usually covers "the bare necessities" of running a music ministry (e.g. organ/piano tunings, several new choral anthems every year, handbell equipment, music licenses, just to name a few). We've also begun supporting college students (music scholars) who sing or play instruments in our worship services and receive a small stipend to support them in their educational endeavors.

In addition to these regular operating costs, you have provided some special funds over the years that allow our music ministry to sparkle and grow. When someone donates to the designated Music Fund, we are able use it to support larger purchases (such as our timpani), music

equipment, CD recordings our music ministry has produced over the years, and guest musicians.

We are also fortunate to have the Special Music Endowment, which funds organ repairs, guest musicians, and special music projects. This endowment has been instrumental over the years, allowing us to have many guest musicians for special occasions like cantatas, Easter services, and hymn sings.

Recently, one of our former choir members, Creighton Wellman, included Highland's music ministry in his will, which has bolstered several projects such as purchasing new musical instruments and allowing for additional music scholars.

To have a thriving music ministry, we need both the skilled and dedicated volunteers that we're known for having and the funds to support it. It is a great honor to serve this congregation, which supports this ministry so faithfully and completely. Thank you very much for allowing me to have the best job in the world.


