Sunday, June 8, 4-7 PM, Laurel Hills Park



Holy Conversations about Highland's Commitment to Inclusion

Our recently formed Inclusion Working Group will begin its work this Summer to help us effectively and mindfully practice our commitment to inclusion of the LGBTQ+ community. If you've missed any of the decisions, events, or processes that led us to our current position, keep reading to understand what we're trying to accomplish and why.

Highland's Inclusion Working Group: What You Need to Know

- Highland's Staff Parish Relations Committee recently proposed entering into a contract with Rev. Trish Archer, a Deacon in full connection with the UMC, to facilitate a series of Holy Conversations about how we bear witness to our commitment to inclusion of the LGBTQ+ community. Trish was recommended to Highland by the District Superintendent.
- This proposal was approved by the Church Council in a called meeting in April 2025.
- This work will be led by a newly appointed Inclusion Working Group (IWG), comprised of Highland members representing a wide spectrum of viewpoints on this topic. Trish will also facilitate the work of the IWG.

• The IWG will begin its work in Summer 2025. The goal of the IWG is to develop a covenant around which we practice our commitment to inclusion. It is important to note that this work is in no way intended to dial back our commitment to inclusion or reverse any existing decisions regarding inclusion. Rather, the group seeks to develop a deeper sense of understanding, respect, love, and unity among our membership, which will ultimately help our church grow stronger.

We encourage you to be in prayer for the process and please know that you will be updated as it unfolds. Be assured you will have ample opportunity to share your thoughts and concerns in appropriate forums as a part of this process. If you have any questions in the meantime, you are encouraged to speak with a member of our clergy.
